Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy

The Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy serves as one of the nation's key centers for the theory and practice of planning and public policy scholarship and analysis. The Bloustein School offers students four academic programs of study: Doctoral Program in Planning and Public Policy, Master's Program in Public Policy, Master's Program in Urban Planning and Policy Development, and Undergraduate Programs in Planning and Public Policy and in Public Health.
